TOUR 4 Half day Day Asian Side / Morning


The tour will start by crossing the BOSPHORUS BRIDGE to the Asian side of the city for a visit of the BEYLERBEYI PALACE, summer residence of Ottoman Sultans. It will continue with a visit to CAMLICA HILL, the highest point of Istanbul with an extraordinary view of the Bosphorus and European side of the city. Our last stop will be BAGHDAT STREET which is the heart of the Asian side of Istanbul. Full of stores, cafes, pubs, restaurants, bookstores etc. The tour will end with the return to the Congress Center.

Bosphorus Bridge; Crossing over the intercontinental suspension bridge you will take a step into Asia. Çamlıca Hill; The highest point in Istanbul which offers the possibility of taking the best pictures of the panoramic view. Beylerbeyi Palace; One of the largest, lavishly furnished 19th century summer residences of the Ottoman sultans. Baghdat Street; The most popular street on the Asian side of

Istanbul with elegant boutiques and shopping alternatives.

TOUR 5 Half Day Bosphorus Boat Tour

Bosphorus; is a great source of pride to Istanbul's residents and one of the city's most important sources of transportation. It also provides a scenic means of viewing both the European and Asian sides of this fascinating city. Both sides include 19th and 20th century wooden houses and villas, palaces, castles, small fishing villages and forests of cypress, pine and magnolia trees, the "Kuleli Military Academy", where Ataturk, the founder of the Republic of Turkey, once studied. The guests will find the time to enjoy the city from the water.



TOUR 6 Full Day Asian Side & Bosphorus Boat Tour

(Combination of Tour 4 & Tour 5 including lunch).

Half Day Traditional Turkish Bath

The Turkish bath was one of the most colourful parts of the Ottoman Empire's social life.

Its big, high domes, heated marble platforms situated in the centre of the city, have helped the Turkish bath to survive until this present day. Not only was it a place to wash, especially for women, the baths were a meeting point where they would choose brides for their sons, and husbands for the young girls. It was a place to show themselves to the women who could arrange marriage for them.

3 Days Cappadocia Tour:

2 Days Ephesus & Pergamon Tour:


Day 1 Fly Izmir - Ephesus Tour - Izmir

The tour will start with a transfer to Istanbul Airport for TK 310 07:00-08:00 flight to Izmir. The guests will have a full day tour of the ancient city of Ephesus. Visit the House Of Virgin Mary, and then the Basilica of St. John (who accompanied the Virgin Mary to Ephesus), the Celsus Library, the marble paved Arcadian Road, the Brothel, the Roman Baths, the Theater where St. Paul preached, the Temple of Artemis (one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World), and see the statue of Ephesians Artemis while touring the Archeological Museum of Ephesus. You will return for overnight to Izmir.

Day 2 Pergamon Tour - Fly back to Istanbul

The group will depart from the hotel for a visit of Pergamon and visit the Acropolis in the city built on four terraces perched upon a hill, overlooking the Bergama Plain. You will then tour the "Steepest Theater of the Ancient World" and visit the Asclepion, the famous ancient medical center dedicated to Asclepion, the god of health and medicine, and the Archaeological Museum in Pergamon.


