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YEAR OVERVIEW

Objectives

The Foundation's objectives are to promote the education of, and research by pharmacists and pharmaceutical scientists within the general fields of design, manufacture, distribution and use of medicines for humans and/or animals.

In order to achieve its objectives the Foundation may undertake any of the following activities:

- < The making of awards in recognition of excellence;
- < The making of grants to support education or research;
- < The granting of Fellowships to permit a period of research at an approved institution.
- < The awarding of Scholarships to permit short periods of international travel in order to study the practice of pharmacy or pharmaceutical science in another country or in other countries;
- < All other charitable activities which do not conflict with the aforementioned objectives or the general objectives of the International Pharmaceutical Federation/ Fédération Internationale Pharmaceutique (FIP).

TRAVEL GRANTS

Every year the FIP Foundation awards a number of FIP Congress Travel Grants to assist pharmacists or pharmaceutical scientists to travel to the FIP congress. The objective of awarding Congress Travel Grants is to permit the recipient to travel to the FIP congress in order to develop, or to help others to develop, skills and/or knowledge in line with the objectives of the Foundation.

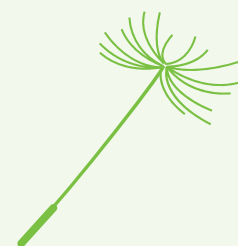
