

Vice President: Stephen Shaddock



After completing a BPharm at Sydney University, Lieutenant Colonel (Ret) Stephen Shaddock was employed in a community pharmacy in Sydney for six years until he joined the Army in March 1980. His initial employment was as a pharmacist at 1st Military Hospital, Yeronga in Queensland. From 1981 to 1987, Steve had numerous postings to various defence units including a field ambulance, field hospital, garrison health facilities and health supply elements as a Senior Stores Officer. On promotion to Major in 1988, Steve held a number of logistics positions, including as a project officer in the Directorate of Capital Procurement, Melbourne, being responsible for the contracting and financial aspects of medical and dental, clothing and mobility projects. His next posting was to Headquarters Logistic Command as the Staff Officer Grade Two Medical and Dental. During this time he was awarded a Support Commander (army) commendation for his commitment to the command's objectives. In December 1999 Steve was promoted to his current rank and assumed the appointment of Staff Officer Grade One (SO1) Health Materiel Logistics and

Pharmacy within the Defence Health Service. Following a restructure in 2013, LtCol Shaddock was appointed as the SO1 Pharmacy which he held until transferring to the army reserve in January 2015.

In 2011, in the Australia Day Honours list, LtCol Shaddock was awarded a Conspicuous Service Cross for outstanding achievement as the SO1 Health Materiel Logistics and Pharmacy within Joint Health Command.
