





## Book and Journal donations

- **ASHP:** AHFS DI (1000 plus), Over 8000 copies of various titles to pharmacy schools e.g.: The Pharmacists Drug Handbook, Handbook Inject. Drugs, Medic. Safety Guide, Preceptors handbook, Consumer Drug Reference, Concepts in Clinical Pharmacokinetics, Medical Abbreviations etc.

ASHP titles reprinted in India: - Concepts in Clinical Pharmacokinetics, 5th edition  
- Compounding Sterile Preparations, 3rd edition - Introduction to Hospital and Health-System Pharmacy. Other titles to follow depending on sales. Special arrangements for bulk shipping of AHFS DI to India under discussion.

- **APhA:** 70 sets of 5 reference books (10 annually)
- **Merck:** 50 sets of Merck publications
- **Facts and Comparisons:** more than 3000 books (2004)

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## Individual practice exposure: clinical pharmacy and drug information

7 people placed for practice exposure/training in 2011 as follows:

Clinical Pharmacy 4 weeks in USA: 2 from India, 2 from Nigeria

Pediatric Pharmacy 4 weeks in Canada: 1 from India, 1 from Uganda

Compounding 2 weeks in USA: 1 from Nigeria

Placements in Finland (Nigerian candidate), in Ghana (Ethiopian candidate), in the UK (Ghanaian and Sudanese candidate) as well as in the US (3 Indian candidates) have been offered and are in the pipeline

Since 2001, over 30 individuals will have undergone practice exposure by the end of 2011 (from Ghana, Egypt, India, Nepal, Nigeria, Peru).

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## University linkages

In many instances contact between trainer and trainees maintained and on occasion special arrangements agreed upon: e.g. research project between Ann Arbor (USA) and Annamalai Nagar (India), 3 months training in pediatrics in Canada for candidates proposed by JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty and Mysore (India)

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## Conditions for practice exposure

- Submission of CV (not more than 2 A4 pages) and training objectives
- Candidate to mobilize funds for airfare and if possible accommodation. 500 euro Pharmabridge subsidy per person if needed

People trained so far are almost all from schools of pharmacy and hospital pharmacies. Many are waiting to be placed

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## Group training: GMP courses

Course duration: normally up to 5 days

- **Sri Lanka:** June 05
- **Nigeria:** 2005, 2006 and 2007
- **Ghana:** 2007 and 2008 on 5 GMP topics
- **Mongolia:** August 07

Courses include general GMP and on request specific topics, e.g. "How to inspect", "Validation and Water", "Good Documentation Practices" and "Managing quality control laboratories".

Courses have to be organized locally, preferably jointly by the local pharmaceutical manufacturers association and the National drug regulatory authority

## Other services provided by Pharmabridge

- Linking on specific topics like DI services, HIV/AIDS, compounding, drug dependence, oncology, pediatric pharmacy, telepharmacy etc
- Providing general advice and guidance (e.g. on WHO)

- Use part of your sabbatical to work in a DC as advisor or lecturer (under UN Volunteer scheme for longer term)
- Forward books and journals etc. For US, local IPSF chapters may be prepared to raise money for transport
- Provide advice on postgraduate practice research from a distance
