

FIP STATUTES 2026

Preamble

- Throughout the FIP statutes, the plural form of pronouns will be used to ensure gender neutrality.
- The original English version [thereafter translated into the legal Dutch document] will be relied upon in the case of any dispute between interpretations.
- Following the first mention in full, acronyms will be used throughout the document. A glossary will be provided upon request.

NAME and HEAD OFFICE

Article 1 – the foundation of FIP

On 5 September 1910, at the Tenth International Congress of Pharmacy, it was decided to group together national pharmaceutical associations, federations and societies into one international association to be called the "Fédération Internationale Pharmaceutique / International Pharmaceutical Federation" (hereafter referred to as **FIP**).

FIP MISSION

Article 2

- 2.1 FIP has as its mission: *To support global health by advancing pharmaceutical practice, sciences, and education, advocating for pharmacists' roles in healthcare systems worldwide, promoting equitable access to medicines and care, and fostering sustainability in pharmacy to address critical challenges such as climate change and global health disparities.*
- 2.2 To achieve its mission, FIP will engage in those activities listed in the Strategic Plan, adopted by the Council.
- 2.3 To achieve its mission, FIP is assisted and supported by FIP Sections and Special Interest Groups (hereafter referred to as **SIGs**), the FIP Foundation for Education and Research, and all other FIP structures.

- 2.4. FIP will be guided by the following core values, all being equally important:
- 2.4.1. **commitment:** to the continued reform and improvement of pharmaceutical sciences, practice, and education.
 - 2.4.2. **collaboration:** with all the healthcare parties involved to effect positive change.
 - 2.4.3. **excellence:** promoting and supporting best practices.
 - 2.4.4. **integrity and transparency:** in every action that is carried out towards FIP members, partners, and other stakeholders.
 - 2.4.5. **responsibility:** toward both society and FIP members.
 - 2.4.6. **spirit of inquiry:** welcoming and showing respect for different points of view.
 - 2.4.7. **caring:** a focus on the individual, the family and the community.

FIP RULES

Article 3

- 3.1. The FIP Board will make Rules that are deemed necessary to achieve its goals and governance, setting forth guidance on ways of working to carry out its activities to support these FIP Rules.
- 3.2. The FIP Rules apply to all FIP structures, FIP officers and volunteers, and FIP staff.
- 3.3. No Rule can be introduced that could override the revision or cancelation of other Rules as indicated in articles 3.1 and 3.2.

FIP MEMBERS

Article 4 - Categories of members

- 4.1. FIP comprises of the following categories of members:
 - 4.1.1. Member Organisations.

- 4.1.2. Allied Organisations [including sub-category: Academic Institutional Members, hereafter referred to as **AIMs**].
 - 4.1.3. Observer Organisations.
 - 4.1.4. Individual Members.
 - 4.1.5. Honorary Members.
- 4.2. Any reference to FIP membership in these Statutes will be deemed to include all categories of members.

Article 5 – FIP Member Organisations

- 5.1. On the proposal of the FIP Board, the Council may grant Member Organisation (MO) status to legally constituted organisations that represent pharmacists and/or pharmaceutical scientists and/or pharmacy educators at the national or subnational level.
- 5.2. The Council may accept that pharmacists or pharmaceutical scientists be represented by more than one organisation in a given country, and that any of these organisations be admitted into membership of FIP.

Article 6 – FIP Allied and Observer Organisations

- 6.1. On the proposal of the FIP Board, the Council may grant Allied Organisation status to those organisations which themselves are made up of organisations representing the pharmacy profession across different parts of the globe. Their membership may well have recognised heritage, history, and language and may span a historical set of nations and they actively support FIP's work to benefit their respective members and for FIP to support them and their members.
- 6.2. The Allied Organisation category has been expanded to include **Academic Institutions** at FIP. These are academic institutions, such as universities or colleges, made up of academic staff who develop, offer and deliver pharmacy programmes.
- 6.3. The Council may accept more than one Allied Organisation from any given country.
- 6.4. On the proposal of the FIP Board, the Council may grant Observer Organisation status to those organisations that provide essential services to the profession in terms of regulatory standards and can be called upon to advise FIP. These organisations often do not have

advocacy or representative functions and therefore cannot be full members of FIP. They can work closely with FIP and advise where appropriate, but in an observer capacity.

- 6.5. The Council may accept more than one Observer Organisation from any given country.

Article 7 – FIP Individual Members

- 7.1 Individual Members are persons who wish to contribute to the work of and support the development of FIP.

Article 8 – FIP Honorary Members

- 8.1. On the proposal of the FIP Board, the Council may award the title of Honorary President to former Presidents of FIP who have given exceptional service to FIP.
- 8.2. The FIP Board may award the title of Honorary Member to persons who have rendered significant service to FIP.

Article 9 - Admission of members

- 9.1. An organisation seeking admission into FIP membership will apply in writing to the Chief Executive Officer (hereafter referred to as the CEO).
- 9.2. Once the application has been assessed and meets the criteria for the specific category of membership and offers a clear benefit to FIP and its Member Organisations, the FIP Board will make a recommendation to the Council for admission to membership.
- 9.3. Where an applicant organisation is from a country which is already represented by one or several Member Organisations, they will be consulted prior to the application being considered by the Council, with regard to *Article 5*.
- 9.4. Only applications that meet the criteria for membership will be accepted for membership. The FIP Board has the right to refuse admission to membership on such grounds, as appropriate.

Article 10 - Loss of membership benefits and/or status.

- 10.1. All organisations in membership may resign from FIP at the end of a calendar year, provided they notify the CEO of their intention in writing at least one year in advance.
- 10.2. The notice period in Article 10.1 may be shortened at the discretion of the FIP Board.
- 10.3. On the proposal of the FIP Board, the Council may cancel the membership of any organisation.
- 10.4. On the proposal of the FIP Board, the Council may deny member benefits to any Member Organisation, apart from voting rights which, in Dutch law, remain the right of every Member Organisation.
- 10.5. The FIP Board may consider extenuating circumstances that influence the decision to take any of the actions listed in Articles 10.3 and 10.4.
- 10.6. Other categories of membership who either fail to pay membership dues by a specified date following a proper demand for such payment, or who prove unworthy of membership as deemed appropriate by the FIP Board, may have their membership cancelled as per the relevant FIP Rules in Article 10.3.

THE MAIN STRUCTURES OF FIP

Article 11

- 11.1. The **main structures of FIP** governance and delivery are:
 - 11.1.1. FIP Council.
 - 11.1.2. FIP Board.
 - 11.1.3. FIP Executive Committee.
 - 11.1.4. FIP Advisory Committees.
 - 11.1.5. FIP Sections; Special Interest Groups (SIGs); and Focus Groups.
 - 11.1.6. FIP Regional Forums
 - 11.1.7. FIP Head office.
- 11.2. The FIP Board may set up **Advisory Committees**, comprised of members of the FIP Board, Council and other structures the Board deems important for the focus and remit of said Advisory Committee, with Council approval.

- 11.3. The FIP Board may create further structures to advance the aims of FIP, to support the FIP strategy, to seek advice on matters of importance and provide ways to ensure the delivery of the FIP development goals underpinned by data and evidence for Member Organisations and Allied Organisations, with Council approval.
- 11.4. The FIP Board will take advice for matters relating to Continuing Professional Development from qualified sources.
- 11.5. Regional engagement with membership across the 6 World Health Organization (WHO)-defined regional geographies, will be ensured through the Regional Pharmaceutical Forums, primarily focussed on practice and policy, through MOs across the regions. The Regional Pharmaceutical Forums will work to deliver the FIP strategy.
- 11.6. Regional engagement with AIMs across the 6 WHO-defined regional geographies, will be through the FIP UNITWIN Centres for Excellence, primarily focussed on education and science, through AIMs across the regions. The Centres for Excellence will work to deliver the shared strategy agreed by FIP and UNESCO.
- 11.7. The FIP Board reserves the right to set up working groups and groups of experts for specific workstreams and tasks. These may well be time limited, for example, policy committees for Statements approved by Council.
- 11.8. The FIP Board will develop the Rules of the Council, then ultimately decided by Council.

THE FIP COUNCIL

Article 12 - Composition

- 12.1. The Council will comprise of the following:
 - 12.1.1. The members of the FIP Board.
 - 12.1.2. One (1) representative of each of the Member Organisations.
 - 12.1.3. One (1) representative of each of the Sections.
- 12.2. The Council may be attended by observers, which are the following:
 - 12.2.1. Honorary Presidents.

- 12.2.2. One (1) representative of each of the Allied Organisations.
- 12.2.3. One (1) representative of the Academic Institutional Members (AIM).
- 12.2.4. One (1) representative of each of the Observer Organisations (OO).

Article 13 - Voting rights and weighted voting

13.1. Voting rights of **Member Organisations in the Council** will be exercised as follows:

- a) Each Member Organisation will receive a base allocation of three (3) votes.
- b) In addition, each Member Organisation will receive further votes in accordance with the number of pharmacy professionals and/or pharmaceutical scientists / pharmacy educators it represents, as set out in Table 1.
- c) For the purposes of this Article, “membership size” is the number of members directly or indirectly represented by the Member Organisation, as reported to FIP and verified in accordance with FIP Rules.
- d) All Member Organisations will be treated in the same manner for voting purposes as laid out in the FIP Rules.

13.2 **FIP Sections** will have votes in proportion to their membership.

13.3. The **FIP President** will cast a single vote on behalf of the FIP Board.

13.4. **Council observers** Honorary Presidents and the representatives of Allied Organisations and Observer Organisations are all observers of the Council. They will have the right to attend Council meetings and to participate in debates but will have no voting rights.

13.5. **Individual Members** may also attend Council meetings as observers without voting rights and may only participate in debates upon invitation by the President.

- 13.6. No members of the Council may delegate their vote(s) to another member.
- 13.7. All eligible to vote [**Member Organisations and Section Presidents**] will appoint their respective delegates to the Council prior to the Council meetings and will notify the FIP Head office of the identity of such delegates.
- 13.8 If the FIP Board has sent notice of a Council meeting, the members will be authorized to exercise their voting rights by means of an electronic means of communication, provided
- (i) the conditions for the use of that means of communication like the connection, the security and the like have been made public in the notice to the meeting.
 - (ii) the member is able to be identified.
 - (iii) the member is able to acquaint himself of the discussions at the meeting, and
 - (iv) if this option has been opened, the member is able to participate in the discussions.

Article 14 – The functions of the FIP Council

- 14.1. The FIP Council will take all decisions relating to the professional, scientific and educational policies of FIP, which the FIP Board will thereafter implement.
- 14.2. In particular, the FIP Council is entrusted with:
 - 14.2.1. The election of the FIP President through the election of the FIP President elect who will assume the FIP Presidency one year after election.
 - 14.2.2. The ratification of the elections of eight (8) Vice Presidents nominated by the Sections and SIGs elected by the FIP Board.
 - 14.2.3. The election of four (4) FIP Vice Presidents proposed by the FIP Board after nomination by Member Organisations in the FIP Council.
 - 14.2.4. The confirmation of the removal of an FIP officer in the event of violation of the Code of Conduct or relevant Rules as stipulated in Article 16.12.12 on the proposal of the FIP Board.
 - 14.2.5. Approval of the FIP Strategic plan.
 - 14.2.6. Consideration of all reports from the FIP Board and reports from all Sections, submitted via the FIP Board.
 - 14.2.7. Consideration of items of general interest from any structure of FIP, submitted through the FIP Board.
 - 14.2.8. Discussion and adoption of the FIP financial report.
 - 14.2.9. The determination of the scale of membership dues for all membership categories.
 - 14.2.10. The consideration of applications for the admission to membership on the recommendation of the FIP Board.

- 14.2.11. The ratification of Honorary Presidents on the proposal of the FIP Board.
- 14.2.12. The ratification of proposals for the cancellation of memberships on the recommendation of the FIP Board.
- 14.2.13. The consideration of proposals for the establishment or dissolution of any structure in FIP on the recommendation of the FIP Board.
- 14.2.14. Any amendment to the Statutes of FIP in accordance with Article 15, and
- 14.2.15. Consideration of a proposal from the FIP Board for the dissolution of FIP.

Article 15

- 15.1. Decisions of the FIP Council will be taken by means of a simple majority vote, weighted as described in Article 13, unless otherwise specified in these Statutes.
- 15.2. Any proposal that requires Council to take a decision will require a quorum of at least half of the Member Organisations to take a vote.
- 15.3. Any proposal to amend the Statutes of FIP will require a vote in favour by at least two-thirds of the votes in the FIP Council.
- 15.4. The CEO will despatch the agenda for the FIP Council, accompanied by the reports pertaining to it, to the members of the Council at least six weeks prior to the meeting.
- 15.5. Any proposal intended for the FIP Council agenda will reach the CEO, accompanied by a brief explanatory note, at least three months prior to the date of the meeting.
- 15.6. The President may include items for inclusion after the prescribed deadline on the FIP Council agenda if deemed urgent and worthy of Council consideration.
- 15.7. Similarly, Member Organisations of FIP may enter a plea of urgency for a proposal not included in the FIP Council agenda. Details of which are

provided in the FIP Board Handbook but remains at the discretion of the FIP President as Chair of the Council.

- 15.8. The FIP Council will decide on whether discussion of an urgent item included on the agenda is appropriate, upon approval of the agenda.
- 15.9. Members of the FIP Council will receive a report containing the text of all decisions taken.
- 15.10. The FIP Council will meet at least once a year, or when the President, or if in the case of an emergency, the FIP Board or as in Article 15.1, a simple majority of the Council members, deem it necessary.

THE FIP BOARD

Article 16

Article 16 – The FIP Board

- 16.1. The FIP Board comprises a total of thirteen (13) members, each with a single vote at the FIP Board.
- 16.2. These include:
 - 16.2.1. The FIP President.
 - 16.2.2. Twelve (12) FIP Vice Presidents on the recommendation of the FIP Board.
 - 16.2.2.1 Four (4) of the Vice Presidents, nominated to the Board by FIP Member Organisations at Council.
 - 16.2.2.2 Eight (8) of the Vice Presidents will be nominated by the Sections and SIGs to the FIP Board.
 - Of these,***
 - 16.2.2.3 Two (2) FIP Vice Presidents, with agreed responsibilities for Pharmaceutical Practice.
 - 16.2.2.4 Two (2) FIP Vice Presidents, with agreed responsibilities for Pharmaceutical Education.

16.2.2.5 Two (2) FIP Vice Presidents, with agreed responsibilities for Pharmaceutical Sciences.

16.2.2.6 All Vice Presidents will have responsibilities for engagement, liaison and representation across FIP as agreed by the FIP Board.

- 16.3 The FIP Board assesses the validity of all nominations received for President Elect and Vice Presidents according to the FIP Rules.
- 16.4 Nominations for FIP President Elect can be put forward by the Member Organisations at Council.
- 16.5 As far as possible, the FIP Vice Presidents should be chosen in such a manner as to ensure that all parts of the world are represented.
- 16.6 The FIP Board are elected for terms of office of four years. No consecutive second terms will be served.
- 16.7 For the position of **FIP President Elect**, elections must be conducted in the penultimate year, so that the person-elect has a full year of overlap with the current office holder. The FIP President Elect does not have voting rights.
- 16.8 For the positions of **FIP Vice Presidents Elect for practice, education and science**, elections must be conducted in the penultimate year, so that the person-elect has a full year of overlap with the current office holder. These FIP Vice Presidents Elect do not have voting rights.
- 16.9 Only in exceptional cases and uncertainties regarding the continuity of FIP due to global crises [for example: world wars, pandemics], can the Presidency be extended. This extension will be decided by a vote of the FIP Council, for a minimum of one year and no longer than four years.
- 16.10 Fiduciary responsibility for FIP is vested in the FIP Board.

- 16.11. The FIP Board is responsible for implementing the strategic decisions of the FIP Council.
- 16.12. The FIP Board will:
- 16.12.1 Implement the decisions of the Council.
 - 16.12.2 Facilitate relations between the Council and those persons or bodies having been assigned a special task.
 - 16.12.3. Appoint the CEO.
 - 16.12.4. Propose to the Council candidates for the President-elect and Vice President positions.
 - 16.12.5. Determine the venues of FIP Congresses.
 - 16.12.6. Recommend to Council the scale of annual membership dues for all membership categories.
 - 16.12.7. Forward to the Council the reports of the various structures of FIP as well as any proposals it receives when it deems them of general interest, including Rules for FIP structures.
 - 16.12.8. Receive reports on the cancellation of the membership by the FIP Head office, as provided for in Articles 9 and 10.
 - 16.12.9 Recommend the award of the title of Honorary Member to persons who have rendered significant service to FIP.
 - 16.12.10. Approve the selection of recipients for FIP awards and recognition as defined by relevant Rules.
 - 16.12.11 According to Article 14, recommend the removal of FIP officer in the event of violation of the Code of Conduct, in accordance with the relevant Rules and subject to ratification by the Council at the next meeting after such a decision is actioned.
 - 16.12.12 Approve and ratify the Section Statutes.

- 16.13. The FIP Board is the legal representative body of FIP.
- 16.14. Furthermore, FIP is represented by the President and an Executive Committee member acting jointly.
- 16.15. In the event that the **President is absent or unable to act** and there is no President-elect in the FIP Board at that time (the first three years of the presidency), the FIP Board will choose one Vice President to be temporarily charged with the performance of the duties of the President, until a replacement is confirmed by the Council as stated in article 14.
- 16.16. In this article **“the absence or inability to act”** is understood to mean:
- I) illness; or*
 - II) inaccessibility; or*
 - III) resignation; or*
 - IV) death.*
- 16.17. The FIP Board will meet at least once a year or more frequently if the President or a majority of its members deem it necessary.
- 16.18. The FIP Board will take decisions by means of a simple majority vote, with the FIP President having the casting vote.

THE FIP EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Article 17

- 17.1. The FIP Executive Committee is comprised of:
- 17.1.1. The President, elected by the FIP Council.
 - 17.1.2. Vice Presidents designated as responsible for strategic decisions.
- 17.2. The Executive Committee prepares the agenda for the FIP Board and oversees the co-ordination of the activities of FIP.

- 17.3. The FIP Executive Committee will meet as required by the President or by the majority of its members.
- 17.4. The President may invite any person whom it considers appropriate to the FIP Executive Committee meeting or a part thereof.
- 17.5. Any FIP Board member who is not on the FIP Executive Committee may attend an FIP Executive Committee meeting in the capacity of an observer.

Article 18 –The FIP President

- 18.1. The President of FIP is Chair of the Council, the FIP Board and the FIP Executive Committee.
- 18.2. The President, as they deem necessary can be a non-voting [*ex officio*] member of the Sections and other structures that may be introduced.
- 18.3. The President is elected one year prior to taking office. During this year, the President-elect is a member of the FIP Board without voting rights.

THE FIP SECTIONS and SPECIAL INTEREST GROUPS

Article 19

- 19.1. Sections responsible for representing domains of pharmacy relevant to FIP's mission and vision are established by the FIP Board, after approval by the Council.
- 19.2. Relevant SIGs will be established as a substructure of a Section to comprise individuals interested in and with expertise in, specific areas of interest to the Section(s) and deemed of importance to FIP by the FIP Board.
- 19.3. Individual members of FIP may choose to be members of one or more Sections. In addition, individual members may choose to become members of one or more SIGs.
- 19.4. The FIP Board will approve the Statutes for all Sections and ensure consistency across FIP for membership, finances, projects and events.

- 19.5. In line with the FIP Rules, each Section and SIG will provide for individual members seeking to be part of these structures so that they are fully represented and engaged as appropriate.
- 19.6. In line with the FIP Rules, the Sections and SIGs may organise activities, in collaboration with other FIP structures.
- 19.7. Each Section will hold a Section Assembly during each year.
- 19.8. Each Section is able to determine their day-to-day operations in line with the FIP Rules to ensure autonomy and engagement with their individual members.

THE FIP HEAD OFFICE

Article 20 – The FIP Head office

- 20.1. The FIP ‘Head Office’ is a term describing of all FIP staff members. It is led and managed by the Chief Executive Officer (CEO).
- 20.2. The CEO handles FIP’s operations, according to dictate of the President and the FIP Board and under their supervision. In particular, the CEO is responsible, for all staff matters, the management of financial affairs, for keeping records, for summoning members to meetings and for implementing the decisions of the structures of FIP, in agreement with the President.
- 20.3. The CEO should be in regular contact with the President.
- 20.4. The CEO must keep current the list of the members of FIP, of members of the Council and the Sections.
- 20.5. The CEO is a participant of the Council without voting rights. The CEO is an ex officio member of all other structures of FIP apart from the Council, again without voting rights.

THE FINANCES OF FIP

Article 21

- 21.1. The financial year of FIP is the calendar year.

- 21.2. The financial resources of FIP comprise of:
- 21.2.1. Membership fees.
 - 21.2.2. Donations, voluntary contributions or bequests from individuals, societies or other institutions.
 - 21.2.3. Revenues from corporate partnerships and entities.
 - 21.2.4. The proceeds of any other activities of FIP.
- 21.3. The membership dues are payable before the end of the first quarter of each year.
- 21.4. If the payment of dues has not been made by the deadline stipulated, the CEO will take all possible steps to recover the outstanding monies.
- 21.5. The FIP Board will approve and remit funding required for the functioning of all FIP structures through the FIP Budget. Details of funding by and through all member-based structures are detailed in the relevant FIP Rules.
- 21.6. At the annual meeting of the Council, the FIP Board will present the annual report and the audited annual accounts and reports on the affairs and conduct of business of FIP in the past financial year.
- 21.7. The annual accounts will be audited by a firm of accountants to be appointed by the FIP Board, in accordance with the laws of the Netherlands.
- 21.8. The accountants will examine the annual accounts, report thereon to the FIP Board, and submit an opinion with regard thereto. The accountants' report will be presented to the Council.
- 21.9. The net worth of FIP consists of all assets of FIP less foreseen liabilities, including the assets and liabilities of the FIP Board, the FIP Sections and Special Interest Groups and the Regional Pharmaceutical Forums.
- 21.10. An audited balance sheet for Sections and SIGs will be included separately in annual report.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 22 - Limitation of FIP activities

The FIP will not interfere in matters which properly are the responsibility of national associations.

Article 23 - FIP Officers

- 23.1. An FIP officer is defined as any volunteer holding an official position within any FIP structure referred to directly or indirectly in these Statutes or by virtue of an *ad-hoc* appointment by the FIP Board and the Council.
- 23.2. FIP officers must be individual members of FIP.
- 23.3. FIP officers may be removed by the FIP Board if they do not comply with the FIP Rules.

Article 24 - Modification of statutes

Any amendment to these Statutes will come into effect at the closure of the Council meeting at which the amendment has been adopted as in article 15.3, the statutes should be laid down in a notarial deed, signed by two members of the FIP Executive Committee.

Article 25 - Dissolution of FIP

- 25.1. A proposal to dissolve FIP could be initiated by the FIP Board and submitted to the Council for consideration.
- 25.2. The procedure for consideration of a proposal for dissolution would be as follows:
 - 25.2.1 The proposal will first require a two-thirds vote in favour by the FIP Board.

- 25.2.2 The proposal from the FIP Board will require at least two-thirds vote in favour by the Council, before it is actioned.
- 25.2.3. The announcement of a meeting of the Council for this purpose will be sent to Member Organisations by email and to other members through appropriate means.
- 25.2.4. In order to consider a proposal for dissolution, the Council will require a quorum of at least half of the Member Organisations.
- 25.2.5. If the Council is unable to meet the quorum requirement, the question will then be submitted in writing to all those members with voting rights in the Council.
- 25.2.6. The dissolution of FIP will be affected by the Executive Committee, through the appointment of an Executor.
- 25.2.7. In the event of dissolution of FIP, the appointed Executor will transfer any remaining assets to an international Non-profit Organisation with aims similar to those of FIP.
- 25.2.8. After dissolution, the books and records of FIP will remain in the custody of the Executor appointed for that purpose by the Executive Committee for a period of ten years.

Article 26

- 26.1. In all events not foreseen by the Statutes or any other governing Rules, or where these are considered unclear, the FIP Board will decide or, if it so wishes, may defer the decision to the Council.
- 26.2. All such decisions must be in accordance with the laws of the Netherlands.
