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


FIP Strategic Plan

FIP's three strategic objectives



- Advance pharmacy practice in all settings
- Advance the pharmaceutical sciences
- Increase FIP's role in reforming pharmacy and pharmaceutical sciences education



FIP Centennial Declaration



“Pharmacists and Pharmaceutical scientists accept responsibility and accountability for improving global health and patient health outcomes by closing gaps in the development, distribution, and responsible use of medicines. Society can contribute to these objectives by supporting the advancement of pharmacy practice and the pharmaceutical sciences.”



Why a Global conference focusing on education?



- **There is no workforce without education.** Therefore it is fundamental for the international community to agree on how pharmaceutical workforce competency is assured through initial and subsequent education.
- The concept of a continuously competent workforce is of **central interest for professional leadership bodies** and professional stakeholders.
- As FIP Member organisations drive **development of the profession** (e.g. new services and roles), their strategy should always include **an education component** (initial education and CPD)
- FIP as the global leadership body is the right platform to bring together pharmacy leaders from across the globe to set the future milestones for pharmacy education in a context of workforce development.



Expected outcomes of the Global Conference



- A global and shared **Vision** will be adopted: its consists of a **description of the future directions of our profession** and **how education can support** that evolution (of practice and sciences)
- **Workforce Development Goals** will be adopted by the profession to implement the Vision:
 - *They are aligned with United Nations SDG 3 – Health Focus – and the WHO Human Resources for Health Strategy 2030*
 - *They are measurable, feasible and tangible; and relevant to all countries*
- **Statements on Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences Education** – 60 statements grouped in 8 clusters
